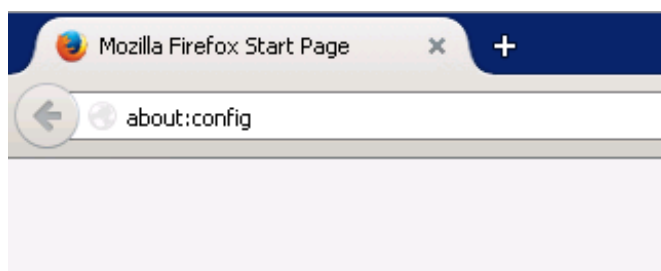

Windows

1. Open Firefox.
2. Open a new web browser tab.
3. Type `about:config` in the address bar.
4. Press [Enter].



5. Click **I'll be careful, I promise!** in the warning window.



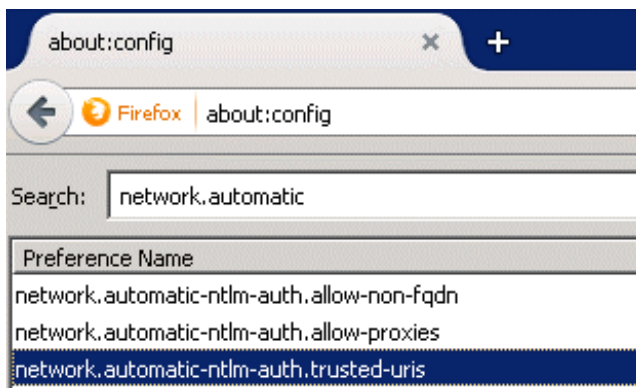

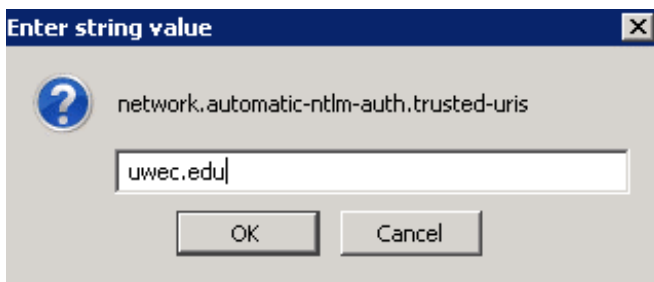

6. Type `network.automatic` into the search bar.
7. Press [Enter] on the keyboard.
8. Select the **`network.automatic-ntlm-auth.trusted-uris`** option from the list by double-clicking.



9. Type `uwec.edu` into the *Enter string value* box that appears.
10. Click **OK**.



11. The **`network.automatic-ntlm-auth.trusted-uris`** option should now look as follows:

<code>network.automatic-ntlm-auth.allow-proxies</code>	default	boolean	true

12. Restart Firefox.
13. Log into your site. The logged on credentials will be passed through to the web server.

Mac

1. Open Firefox.
2. Open a new browser tab.
3. In the address bar, type `about:config` to display the list of current configuration options.
4. Type `negotiate` in the *Filter* field to restrict the list of options.
5. Double-click the **network.negotiate-auth.trusted-uris** entry to display the *Enter string value* dialog box.
6. Type `UWEC.EDU`.
7. Click **OK**.
